1. NEW REQUESTS FOR ADVICE TO THE SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE RECOMMENDED BY THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEES

1.1 NARWHAL AND BELUGA

R-3.4.15: To prioritise investigating alternative survey methods and survey frequency for small stocks, with a focus on beluga and narwhal in East Greenland.

R-3.4.16: To prioritise the collection and analysis of information to improve the understanding of stock structure of beluga whales in East Greenland, which may allow future assessments for this species in this area.

2. REQUESTS FOR ADVICE TO THE SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE REFORMULATED BY THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEES

2.1 BEARDED SEAL

R-2.7.1: To complete its review and assessment of bearded seals <u>when the necessary data</u> <u>become available, and collect and analyse existing information</u>.

2.2 RINGED SEAL

R-2.3.3: To complete its review and assessment of ringed seals <u>when the necessary data become</u> <u>available</u>, and collect and analyse existing information.

2.3 GREY SEAL

R-2.4.2: To provide a new assessment of grey seal stocks in all NAMMCO areas.

2.4 NARWHAL AND BELUGA

R-3.4.11: To update the assessment of both narwhal and beluga, <u>when</u> new data warrant such an exercise.
